

Instructions to authors wishing to submit educational material to the EUNOS website

General comments

- Both didactic lectures and case presentations are acceptable
- The aim is to provide a free educational resource for all trainees and trainers who are members of EUNOS
- Lectures and cases will be linked on the website to the relevant topics in the EUNOS neuro-ophthalmology curriculum; this will enable site visitors to quickly find all educational material on any given topic
- Cases must be anonymised with removal of all personal identifiers
- Authors will be asked to confirm that they have obtained written consent from the patient to use their material on this website
- The format for all uploaded material will be as Powerpoint slides

Lectures

- Should be aimed at the generalist or trainee, not at the experts
- Should be clinical rather than research-oriented
- Should cover topic(s) on the EUNOS neuro-ophthalmology curriculum
- The slides should be self-explanatory
- Author name, affiliation and date should be provided on the title slide

Case presentations

- Authors are encouraged to insert their case material into the standard template provided
- Suggestions and instructions for each section of this template are given as notes with each slide. As for lectures, authors will be asked to provide name, affiliation and date on the title slide
- The emphasis is on brevity and simplicity – information should only be included if it is necessary for understanding the case
- Unique or exceptionally rare material will generally not be suitable – the aim is to show typical cases of conditions likely to be seen at least on occasion by most neuro-ophthalmologists
